- **SHARE/PUSH**, a secure virtual fusion cell allowing Alabama's law enforcement and homeland security agencies to integrate and coordinate tips, communicate leads and share investigative information.

In the summer of 2006, the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) unveiled the **Alabama Communications and Operations Portal (AlaCOP)**, the state's official, secure web portal for authorized



Alabama law enforcement and criminal justice officers. Through the **AlaCOP.gov** portal, officers can view state law enforcement announcements (such as Amber Alerts, felony fugitives, missing persons, training announcements, and state law enforcement and homeland security advisories, documents and links). They also can access a major upgrade to Alabama's Law Enforcement Tactical System (LETS). **AlaCOP** provides officers with a person-based search that surveys state court and other databases, such as the state's sex offender registry. Through this option, officers can set alerts on individuals so they can be notified about changes or other searches performed on a given suspect. They also may select options to design and personalize their **AlaCOP** home page, are provided with a free **AlaCOP** e-mail address, and may also access a secure, non e-mail based Message Center for officers to communicate with each other and the state fusion cell. The Message Center feature includes the officer's ability to create private groups (such as investigators working on a particular case) and/or open groups for information sharing on major events, such as the 2006 Alabama church fires. Future versions of **AlaCOP** are expected to integrate National Crime Information Center (NCIC) access for authorized users.

AlaCOP was funded by a FY 2004 grant provided by the Alabama Department of Homeland Security, through the United States Department of Homeland Security.

About the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center

The **Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC)** is the Alabama state agency responsible for gathering and providing critical information for law enforcement and the criminal justice community. Our information systems process more than 15 million transactions per month, and are accessed by more than 15,000 sworn officers in over 900 criminal justice entities within Alabama and across our nation. ACJIC is connected nationally to the FBI's National Crime Information Center, as well as to all 50 states via the National Law Enforcement Telecommunication System (NLETS). Our 24 hour Command Center monitors the network and all of our systems, and our toll free hotline ensures that officers will always be able to reach our help desk staff. ACJIC also publishes a yearly summary, *Crime in Alabama*, that provides a comprehensive picture of crime in the state and snapshots of criminal activity in specific geographical areas.
